By 10 years old I was fortunate enough to be a level 9 National competitor in the USAG Jr. Olympic program traveling around the country. I am a 3 time national competitor ranking as high as 27th in the country. I was lucky to have my sister Cristina Ortiz (Siegert) with me, making us one of the first sister-acts from Minnesota to make it to Nationals. As a high school athlete, our team worked hard to become the 2003-2004 State Champions. Adding to the rich history of Park Gymnastics!

I have been coaching gymnastics for approximately 18 years. Parent-child classes, recreational, competitive and high school level gymnastics. I started my coaching career at Park High School under the supervision of Mark Sikich, the former head coach and Community Ed. Supervisor. Also known as the “God Father” of this fine program!

While in college at Hamline University I studied Social Justice, Early Childhood Development, and Legal studies. I was involved in the Midway Community Action service learning and light rail community development and planning. I was privileged to be honored as a Ronald E.
